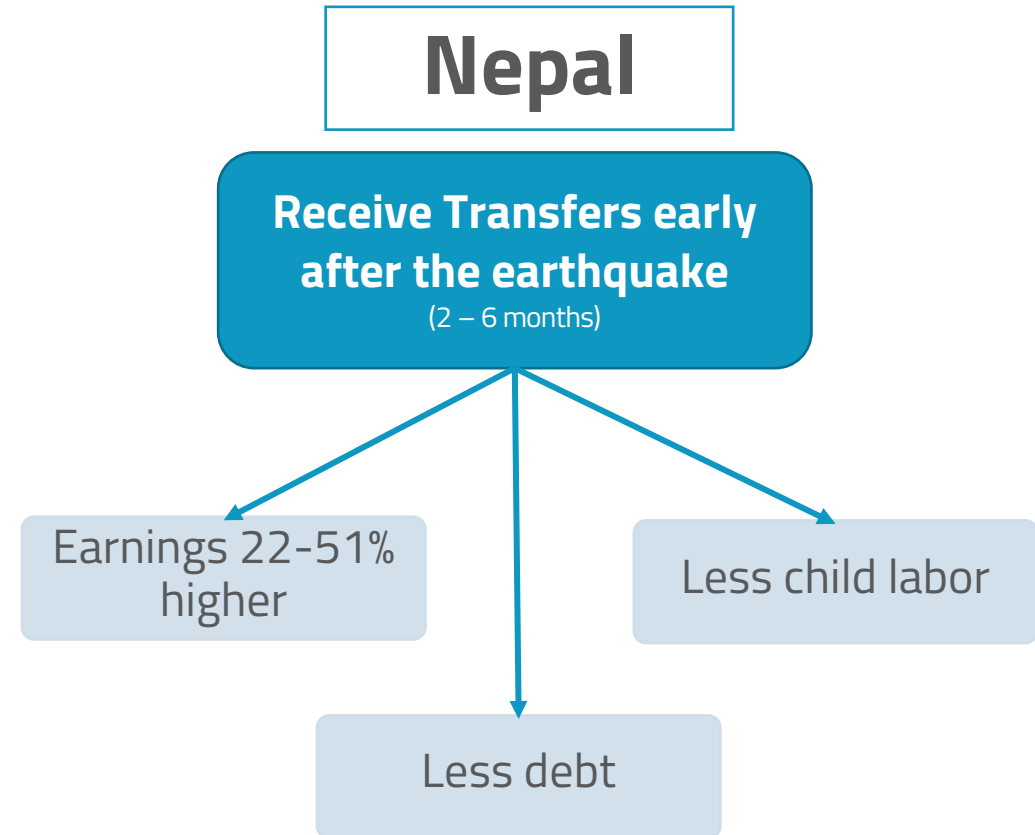

Coordination matters for a **timely, efficient and effective** response to crises

- Coordination enables early action after a crisis
- Coordination avoids duplication of efforts
- Coordination ensures benefits reach those who need them most





Global partnerships and in-country arrangements for social protection

- Programmes only work well if **institutional arrangements and partnerships** work well
- The ambition of ASP is **multi-sectoral**:
 - Build **resilience** of households before shocks
 - Provide a timely crisis **response**
 - Contribute to climate change **adaptation**
- **Policy commitments and operational coordination** to align all actors who are critical for ASP

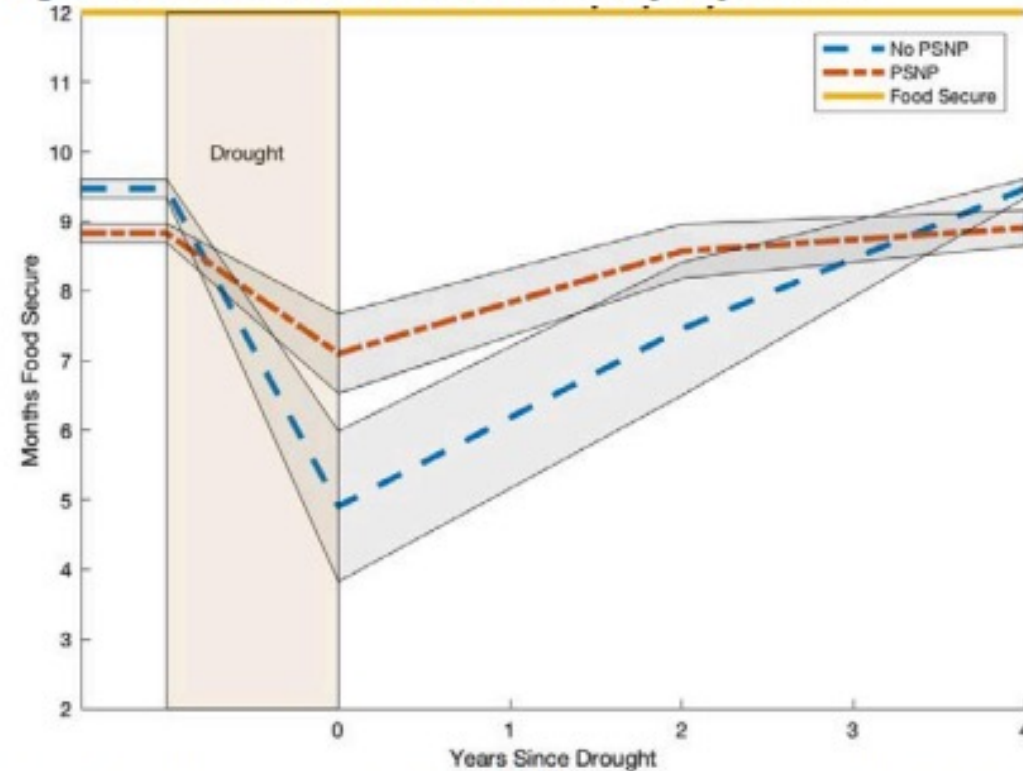


Social protection prevents food insecurity after droughts in Ethiopia

A joint agenda among national and international partners:

Common **policy framework, procedures and financing** for social protection and humanitarian assistance

Partnerships: Fostering convergence in Niger

*German approach:

and supporting government
efforts to build national ASP
systems by working with
WFP, UNICEF & the World
Bank*

- **What?** BMZ-funded COVID-19 relief program, implemented *jointly* by WFP & UNICEF
- **How?** Through the national safety-net program, supported by Germany and others via World Bank Sahel Adaptive Social Protection Program (SASPP)
- Resulted in multiple instances of convergence:
 - Collaboration on **needs analysis**
 - Alignment on **eligibility criteria** and **targeting methods**
 - Shared **payment mechanism** and **M&E instruments**



Partnerships: The road ahead

- USP2030 and SPIAC-B were successful in defining a **common agenda**.
- **Multistakeholder Initiative on Social Protection and the implementation of the Global Accelerator**
 1. **Combine strengths** of UN organizations, international financial institutions, bilateral donors to increase collective effectiveness
 2. **Link policy agendas** of the Global Accelerator, the World Bank's Social Protection Compass, USP2030 and others
 3. Coordinated and **joint support for countries** which are on their way to expand social protection.
 4. Initiative of Minister Schulze: **Joint programme funding with joint global governance structure, joint country teams and dedicated trust funds with the UN and World Bank.**
